Proposed Amendments in

The National Commission for Homoeopathy (Assessment and Rating of Medical Institutions) Regulations, 2024

➤ That, the existing Section 5 sub section (1) shall be read as

Extension of approval for admissions for existing Institutions based on self-disclosure. –

- (i) Existing recognized Homoeopathic Medical Institutions shall be classified into the following categories:
- Extended Permission; and
 - Yearly Permission

All recognized existing homoeopathic medical Institutions with more than five years of establishment for Under-graduate course and three years for Post-graduate course, having permission from Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy or Commission or Government of India continuously during last three years shall get extension of approval for admissions for the subsequent year based on self-disclosure through web portal of the Commission, with an affidavit stating full compliance to Minimum Essential Standards as notified, as per the sanctioned intake capacity of the preceding year; provided that the Institution is not acted upon by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy or Commission or Government of India under the provisions of clause (f) sub-section (1) of section 28 of the National Commission for Homoeopathy Act.

Such institutions shall be permitted to admit students in accordance with the sanctioned intake capacity of the preceding academic year, subject to submission of annual self-disclosure through the designated portal of the Commission. Such colleges may be inspected for necessary verification of compliance of regulation any time during the course of academic year.

However, extension of approval shall not be applicable in the following cases:

- The institution has been subjected to action by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy, Commission or Government under applicable provisions of the Act;
- Any legal, disciplinary, regulatory or enforcement proceedings are contemplated or initiated against the institution; if any
- If any legal or disciplinary issues pending against the Institution.
- If Institution has violated the provisions of regulations on admission of students as specified through the regulations.
- The institution has violated provisions relating to:
 - Minimum Essential Standards;
 - Admission regulations;
 - Counselling guidelines;
 - Academic requirements; or
 - Any other directions issued by the Commission from time to time;



- (f) The institution has applied for new postgraduate course or increase in intake capacity for UG/PG seats for the relevant academic year;
 - (g) Annual assessment fee, inspection fee, visitation fee or digitisation charges have not been deposited within prescribed timelines;
 - (h) Material misstatement or incorrect information is submitted in self-disclosure.
- (ii) Every institution applying under Extended Permission shall submit:
- a) Annual self-disclosure (in proforma as specified by MARBH);
 - b) Affidavit of compliance with notified standards;
 - c) Institutional performance indicators as specified; and
 - d) Any additional information sought by the Commission.
 - e) Submission of self-disclosure shall constitute a declaration of correctness and shall remain subject to verification.
- (iii) Institutions granted Extended Permission may be inspected or audited for risk-based verification, during the academic year for validation of compliance.
- (iv) Extension of approval shall remain valid only for the relevant academic year and shall not create an automatic right for continuation in subsequent years.
- (v) Medical Institutions shall be assessed and rated on measurable quality indicators over and above compliance with Minimum Essential Standards, taking into consideration:
- (a) Academic outcomes and student performance;
 - (b) Faculty availability, qualification and development;
 - (c) Patient exposure and clinical training;
 - (d) Research, publications and innovation;
 - (e) Institutional Governance and transparency;
 - (f) Infrastructure and digital readiness;
 - (g) Community outreach and quality initiatives; and
 - (h) Any additional parameters notified by the Commission.

Rating shall promote continuous quality improvement and not merely regulatory compliance.

- (vi) Where a Deemed University or Autonomous Institution is awarded Grade 'A' and above, such institution may be granted limited academic flexibility including curriculum enrichment, elective components, innovation initiatives and teaching-learning improvements, subject to compliance with competency-based curriculum and standards specified by the Commission.
- (vii) Institutions awarded Grade 'A' and above or up to Grade 'B' may apply for:
- a. Increase in intake capacity of existing programs; or
 - b. Commencement of new programs,
- subject to fulfilment of specified requirements relating to infrastructure, faculty, hospital facilities, academic outcomes and applicable regulations.
- (viii) Where any institution is subjected to regulatory action under relevant provisions of the Act by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy, the assigned grade may be reviewed, suspended or withdrawn.
Provided that:
- a. Reasons shall be recorded in writing;
 - b. Institution shall be provided an opportunity of representation wherever applicable; and
 - c. Continued unauthorized use of withdrawn grade shall attract regulatory action.

- (ix) An institute of any grade, if acted upon by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for National Commission for Homoeopathy under section 8, 9 and 13 of the said regulation, the grade shall



have deemed to be withdrawn, and no communication shall be sent for withdrawal of the grade. If the Institutes continue to use the grade, such Institutes shall be subjected to disciplinary action.

➤ **That, the existing Section 6, sub section (2), clause (ii), the following shall be supplemented**

or Private institutions or deemed to be university.

➤ **That, the existing Section 7, following sub-section (i),(j),(k),(l),(m),(n) and (o) shall be supplemented**

(i) The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy may conduct annual assessment, inspection, visitation or digital verification in accordance with the notified guidelines to determine continued compliance with Minimum Essential Standards. Assessment shall adopt risk-based and outcome-based evaluation principles.

(j) The Board shall communicate its decision regarding inspection, assessment or permission within the specified timeline before commencement of counselling and admissions. Where any deficiencies identified, it shall be recorded with reasons and communicated to the concerned institution.

(k) If assessment reveals material deficiency in records, infrastructure, faculty, hospital services or institutional functioning of institutions under Extended Permission, the Board may:

- i. Issue compliance directions;
- ii. Seek corrective action report;
- iii. Order reassessment; or
- iv. Shift the institution to Yearly Permission category.
- v. Such action shall be based on principles of natural justice.

(l) The Board may order re-assessment any time and any number of times only where:

- i. Serious deficiency exists;
- ii. Corrective compliance is claimed;
- iii. Complaint requires verification.

(m) Online verification of attendance, faculty employment and institutional functioning may be conducted using authorized digital systems subject to applicable privacy and data Governance requirements.


(n) Institutions which have not admitted students or remained without permission continuously for five academic years may be treated as inactive institutions and shall apply afresh under applicable regulations for recommencement.

(o) Data once uploaded shall be used across regulatory, assessment and rating functions to minimise duplication

➤ **That, the existing Section 13 sub-section (7) shall be read as follows:**

The Medical Institutions shall be graded based on the scores obtained during the assessment. Based on the scores, colleges will be rated from A+, A, B+, B and C Grade.

Grade	Assessment Score
A+	Above 80% of the total score
A	Above 70% up to 80% of the total score
B+	Above 60% up to 70% of the total score



B	Above 50% to 60% of the total score
C	Below 50% of the total score

And in said Section 13, sub-section (8) shall be added as

The rating process shall be completed and the details of the grades, shall be made available on the Commission's website or any other public domain as specified by the Commission before the date of commencement of All India Central Counselling Committee, counselling process for admissions.

➤ **That, the existing Section 14, following shall be added after word scheme:**

(New BHMS college, new PG course and enhancement of seats UG/PG)

➤ **That, the existing Section 16, sub section (2), clause (a) shall be Supplemented as follows:**

- (a) The College has to apply to Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy in a specified format providing following information,
- i. In general information: Name of the institution, complete address, year of establishment, name of the trust/society/organization, affiliated university, approval authority etc.
 - ii. Details of previous three years affiliation from concerned university.
 - iii. Details of previous permissions/denial from National Commission for Homoeopathy.
 - iv. Last three years balance sheet, income and expenditure statement and income tax returns of the college.
 - v. Details of the management
 - vi. Reason for proposed closure
 - vii. Details of students in first BHMS, second BHMS, third BHMS and fourth BHMS, Internship and PG Course (if any).
 - viii. Details of teaching staff, non-teaching staff and Hospital staff.
 - ix. Information about Hospital and infrastructure details.
 - x. The Management shall furnish a duly notarized undertaking affirming that , the interests of the students presently enrolled/studying in the institution shall be fully safeguarded, necessary arrangements for transfer/continuation of students shall be made as per directions of the National Commission for Homoeopathy, the concerned University, and other competent authority, all dues of employees, staff, and statutory bodies shall be cleared before closure, the institution shall comply with all directions issued by regulatory authorities regarding closure procedures, no admission shall be made after approval of closure proceedings.
 - xi. List of Documents : Resolution of Governing Body / Trust regarding closure, No Objection Certificate from Affiliated University, details of students and rehabilitation plan, staff settlement details, audited Balance Sheets of last three financial years, income & expenditure Statements, audit reports certified by chartered accountant, bank liability/loan clearance details (if any), pending statutory dues details, copies of previous three years affiliation orders, copies of previous permissions issued by NCH, copy of latest permission/recognition order, affidavit by management, any other relevant documents.
